









Peacekeeping and Renewable Energy in Somalia

Virtual Event, Thursday 21 April, 2022 9:00 to 10:15 am NY time / 15:00 to 16:15 CET / 17:00 to 18:15 UAE time

Somalia and its international peacekeeping missions face some of the highest energy costs in the world, with rates of energy access of less than 40% nationally, and only 11% in rural areas. Ongoing security and governance challenges in the country further complicate Somalia's energy sector, which is among the most decentralized in the world. Partially as a result, Somalia is emerging as a pioneer in the transition of peacekeeping missions from diesel generators to renewable energy through a new private-sector financed business model, while also helping to power host communities.

This virtual event – hosted by Norway and the United Arab Emirates, in collaboration with Powering Peace (an initiative of Energy Peace Partners and Stimson Center) – is part of the series on evaluating energy options in peacekeeping as the UN aims to shift 80% of its energy supply to renewables by 2030. It also occurs in conjunction with the UN, International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA), and Member State initiative to support missions in assessing their energy supply options.

This session will launch the new Powering Peace <u>report</u> Powering Ahead: The United Nations and Somalia's Renewable Energy Opportunity, the first comprehensive assessment of the Somali energy landscape around peacekeeping missions. The event will discuss key themes from the report: the role of Somalia's energy sector in the broader political and conflict dynamics of the country, efforts by the UN mission to transition its energy supply to renewables, and a new public-private business model that can offer a positive legacy for host communities and Somalia's energy sector.

The model – based on the experience of the Kube Energy solar project under construction in Baidoa – moves UN energy procurement budgets from imported diesel to locally produced renewable energy. As a large, stable customer, the UN through its electricity procurement provides a revenue stream to attract private finance for new renewable energy infrastructure – which can also sell power to local businesses and consumers and will outlast the mission.
